An exciting new Restaurant, named "Copper Chimney," opens in Bombay today.

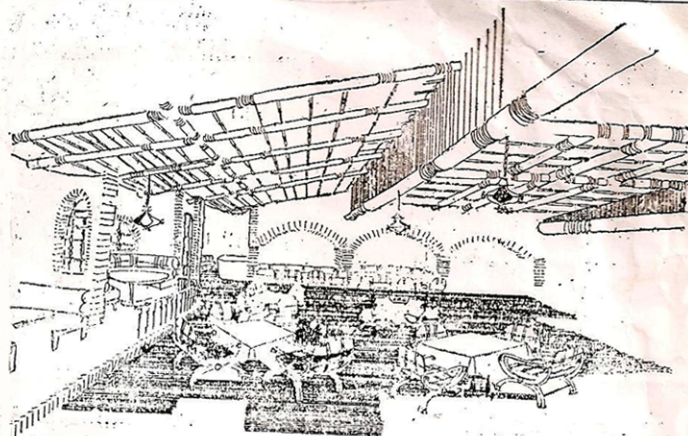

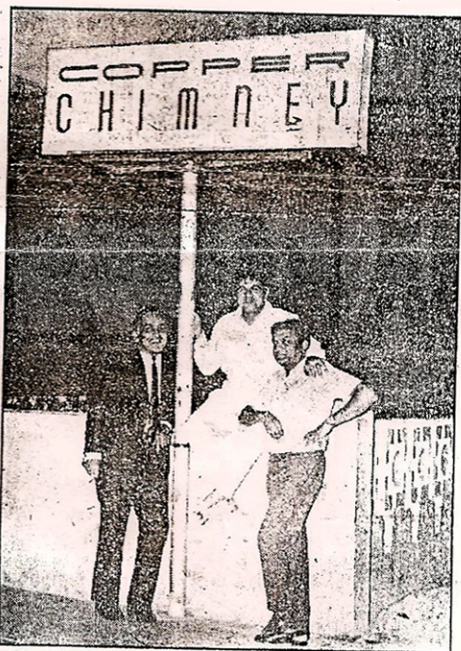
wrought-iron motifs. The hanging-lamps are made of copper and brass and look as though they are designed from an old oil-lamp.
